Recently, we have been having to make lots of repairs. The building is getting old. It all started last June. We found there were repairs needed to the air conditioners, the kitchen drain system, the projection system, and ongoing issues with the computers.

Last Sunday, I did give a small talk before the service began. I am writing now for all those that weren't able to attend.

We are financially sound. We pay all our bills on time and have money in all of our accounts. As of April 30, we have \$15,000 less in offerings than last year. Remember, we did approve a very strict budget. We are spending less and keep a very watchful eye on the budget. So, we are OK.

With that said, thank you to all those that have helped us purchase Hymnals. This wasn't a budget item and we have paid for them all by individual donations. I know this isn't the ideal way to have a service and we are working on how to again use a computer and screens.

At the last council meeting, I said I wasn't able to make the decision as to what to do. We are trying to decide do we buy another Apple, or do we buy a HP – do we continue with the slide program we presently use or do we go to Microsoft Powerpoint or do we see if we can fix this computer. Do we have enough volunteers to do all of this? We want to make sure we make the right decision with the best use of CLC funds.

We have found someone that will meet with us on May 4 and share her knowledge to help us. After my talk on Sunday, one member called to donate a computer they have, another member told us about a computer place they use and we were told about a computer software company that is only for non-profits and prices are low.

Enough information should be available at the next council meeting for us to make decisions and move forward getting our service on the screens soon. Please be patient with us.
